Won driving; second and third the same. MAGIC FLUTE, never far back, was taken to the outside for the drive and drew out under pressure. RASTROL, fastest away, took command while on the outside, raced lapped on the outside of POLLY PICTOR on the turn and into the stretch, but could not resist the winner. PERFECT MARK lacked speed to race with the early pace, but made up some ground between horses in the stretch. POLLY PICTOR weakened in the final furlong after racing with the pace. FLAMM was unable to engage the leaders. CAM FIN raced forwardly to the stretch and quit.

COME EARLY, forwardly placed from the beginning, was forced to lose ground on the outside on the turn while taking command, went to the inside when clear and drew out to win easily. BUSTER T. trailed on the outside early, secured room on the inside to save ground entering the stretch and closed fast. ALA-TOKA took command following the start, but gave way to the winner on the turn, but continued well. FOUR ZONES had early speed, but gave ground gradually and finished in a dead-heat for fourth with CHANCE DAMSEL. The latter made up some ground from a slow beginning. GREY BEARD, between horses, could not keep up.

PINK SLIP took a clear lead on the backstretch, raced on the inside of the winner and through the early stretch, but gave way in the final sixteenth. CRAPE HANGER, never far back but forced to lose some ground, continued well to the end. BEAUTY lost some ground and could not threaten. MICO MISS, far back early, was going well at the end. BESSIE VANCE fell back gradually. LENA DEEN showed a dull effort.

LUCKY FLAG moved into closer contention gradually between horses, took command in the late stretch between calls, but could not resist the winner. WILFUL MAID was hustled to the front and steadied there and held on stubbornly when challenged. CUTE ARTICLE, well placed from the beginning, made a determined bid in the stretch, but weakened. LUCKY KAY and MELVIN R. were never prominent.

The latter, fractious at the post, raced in closest pursuit of the winner throughout and was gradually wearing her down. NEVER AMBER raced evenly and forwardly, but was unable to improve position. EXTORTION made up some ground after being slow to settle into best stride. ARAB'S FANCY had early speed briefly.

MUD GUARD was hustled to the front soon after the start and steadied there, drifted out slightly on the stretch turn and could not resist the winner. CRAZETTE, away slowly, made up some ground and was going well at the end. BOSWELL QUEEN moved up to make a bid in the stretch, but flattened out. CHANCECLIFF could never get up. MITLA was done early.

The latter raced in closest pursuit of the winner from the beginning, started around the outside of the latter in the stretch, but was taken to the inside, closed fast and was wearing down the winner. PENSIVE ONE raced evenly and forwardly on the outside in a good effort. ONWARD MARCH, sluggish early, could not get up. BIMOVER had some early speed.

SILENT MAX was under restraint while racing forwardly and on the inside, was taken to the outside on the final turn to challenge LITTLE BUCK in the lead, but could not resist the winner. LITTLE BUCK was sent to the front and rated there into the stretch, then weakened. GALA BLENHEIM, fractious at the post, did not respond when called upon. GOLDEN THORN was not prominent. ARISTOCRAT showed some speed on the backstretch, but flattened out badly. GALA BLENHEIM pulled a shoe while at the starting gate and there was a delay of fourteen and one-half minutes while it was being replaced.

NEWTOWN, up quickly on the backstretch to take a short lead, just failed to last after a stiff duel with the winner. THE SHACKS, always forwardly placed, saved ground throughout, but was not good enough. CUP O'CHEER lacked early speed, but was going well at the end. VIDARETTA was not prominent.
